Reading at St John's

At St John's we believe that reading is an important foundation of all learning. We focus on developing readers who read with fluency and accuracy and comprehend the texts they read and are read to them.

Daily reading is one of the best things you can do to support your children in their learning, whether that is reading to your child, hearing them read to you, asking them questions about the stories they have read or sharing a book together. Even a little bit every night before bedtime will have a dramatic effect on the quality of children's writing and their vocabulary. Your consistent encouragement at home would be a huge benefit in helping your children "catch" the reading habit and develop an enjoyment in reading for pleasure.



We ask that you do read daily with your child and note any reading activity, however brief, in their reading record. Each week in school we track how many times children have read. Our target is for all children to read **at least 4 times a week**. We celebrate these achievements in our weekly collective worship.

Holidays in term time

When it comes to booking family holidays, please support your child's learning and make sure that your holidays are planned during the 13 weeks of school holidays. All parents have a legal responsibility to ensure their child attends school. Please read our school attendance procedures for an understanding of our approach. We aim to work in partnership with parents to achieve high attendance and the best outcomes for all our children.

Safety around the school site

We gave received some feedback from staff, parents- and even some of our children- about road safety awareness around our school.

Here are some reminders of what we expect:

- Please ensure that you do not ride bikes or scooters on the school grounds, this
 includes the car park entrance. At the beginning and the end of the day it is extremely
 busy and there is a risk of injury to others. If your child comes to school on a bike, we
 expect them to wear a helmet.
- Please do not enter the school car park between 8.30-3.30 unless you have discussed your individual circumstances and they have been approved by school. You may see a couple of cars entering or exiting the car park, these would have been approved.
- Please encourage your children to walk safely using the footpath and remind them to find a safe place to cross the road. There are often several parked cars and there have been reports of children running out between parked cars.

Y3 displayed exemplary behaviour when they were presented with their bibles last week at St John's Church. They were a credit to the school and should feel very proud of themselves.








Goodbye Rev M'Caw
